## PAGE's 3 \& 4: 05/28/2004 @ Hart <br> HIGHLIGHTS of Game 04-30: Hart 5 - Righetti 0 (CIF-SS Quarter Final Game)

Hart Beats Righetti 5-0: Fick pitches 2 hit shutout. Sanchez fielding Gem. Gagnon \& Maddox hit stars
Tyler Fick pitched a brilliant 2 hit shutout over Righetti in the Quarter Final playoff game at Hart, for his 9th win of the season. Fick gave up only 2 hits and struck out 9.

Ryan Gangon drove in a run in the 4th with a "Baltimore Chop" single to 3rd, to score Steve Susdorf who had walked to lead off the inning.
In the top of the 6th, Jimmy Dodos of Righetti hit what was an apparent homer to right, but Hart right fielder Steve Sanchez, leaped up and snagged the ball with his glove over the fence and came down with the ball.
The next batter flew out deep to left and then Josh Thomas doubled, but Fick got out of the inning.
Hart then scored 4 unearned runs in the 6 th, highlighted by a double by Nate Maddox. Hart got 2 walks with the bases loaded and a single by Steve Sanchez to drive in the 4 runs and give Hart a 5-0 lead.

Today Hart had an overflow crown at the quarter final game at Home against Righetti. The last time Hart played Righetti it was in the exciting CIF-SS Division 2 Championship game at Anaheim Stadium in a game won by Hart 10-9. Tyler Fick pitched what is becoming for him "his usual great game". Fick gave up only 2 hits and struck out 4 improving his record to 9-2.

In the Righetti 1st:
Hart's main job was preventing baserunners because as a team Righetti had 63 Stolen bases verses only 21 for Hart. The main culprit was their leadoff batter Jimmy Dodos who had 13 of the 63 steals. On an $0-2$ pitch leading off in the 1 st, Dodos hit a little infield dribbler to short and beat it out. Dodos was immediately erased on a double play. A strikeout ended the 1st inning.

Fick struck out the side in the 2 nd although he did hit a batter.
Fick walked the leadoff batter in the 3rd, but Hart catcher Matt Sreden picked him off 1st. Fick walked the next batter, but got 2 quick ground outs to end the inning.

Fick struck out 2 and walked 1 in the 4 th. He struck out 2 and got a pop up in the 5 th.
Dodos was never on the bases again, but did play a big part in the biggest fielding play in Hart History and he was "absolutely" ROBBED of a game tying Homer leading off the 6 th inning by Steve Sanchez.
It was the 6th inning, Hart led 1-0. The roar of the Righetti crowd as they saw the sure homer heading to right, and the "GIANT ROAR" of Hart fans only moments later when Sanchez leaped up and his glove disappeared over the fence, quickly brought it back, came down and held up his glove with the white ball showing, and his team mates running out to right field to congratulate him. This was something I will never forget.. It was only the 1 st out of the inning. The next batter, Josh Thomas, hit a ball deep to left hauled in by Cole Valancius for the 2 nd out. The 3 rd batter "scorched a drive to left that took a wicked bounce past Valancius to the wall for a double. Fick bore down and got a pop up foul to first baseman Robert Van Scoyoc.

Hart was not doing much against Righetti right hander Ben Grover. His slow tantalizing curve was too much for Hart batters to resist, and they were constantly checking their swings to take a belated cut at the "bender", and were mostly hitting soft squibber grounders, but men were getting on.
Hart had 1st and 3rd with 1 out in the 1 st but Steve Susdorf hit into a double play. In the 2 nd with 1 out, Tyler Fick lined a single to left, but was caught stealing.

In the 3rd with 1 out Robert Van Scoyoc and Cole Valancius singled, and Steve Sanchez sacrificed them to 2nd and 3rd, but a fly to center ended the inning.

The game was scoreless into the Hart 4th. Steve Susdorf walked. Hart got a big break while Matt Sreden was batting, a passed ball sent Susdorf to 2nd. Sreden flied deep enough to center for Susdorf to take 3rd. With the infield in Tyler Fick grounded weakly to 2nd, and Susdorf had to hold at 3rd. With 2 out Ryan Gagnon who won the Anaheim Canyon game with a double, hit one down into the dirt around home plate, and by the time it came down Gagnon was on 1 st with a single, and Susdorf had scored the 1st run.

Hart went down 1-2-3 in the 5th, and the fielding heroics came in the 6 th.
In the bottom of the 6th, with Tyler Fick looking "shaky in the top of the 6th., Hart was looking for some insurance runs. Steve Susdorf grounded to 2nd, the ball took a bad bounce but was ruled an error as the ball caromed off the 2 nd baseman's glove. Sreden sacrificed Susdorf to 2nd. Fick flied to center for the 2nd out. Nate Maddox then got a double down the left field line that the left fielder almost caught, but Susdorf scored the important run.
Ryan Gagnon hit an easy grounder to short that should have ended the inning but the shortstop dropped the ball and runners were on 1st and $3 r d . \operatorname{Van}$ Scoyoc walked to load the bases. Cole Valancius then walked to force in Maddox making it 3-0.

David Lohman relieved Glover at pitcher for Righetti.
Steve Sanchez greeted Lohman with a sharp single to left scoring Gagnon making it 4-0, and then Matt Valaika walked with the bases loaded scoring Van Scoyoc making it 5-0.

With the 5-0 lead, Fick took the mound in the 7 th and got a lazy fly to center, pop up to 2 nd and a game ending 9 th strikeout.

Hart batters only struck out 2 times as opposed to 11 times against Anaheim Canyon.
Hart batters walked 5 times and had a hit batter.
Hart batters had 6 hits, the double by Maddox, and 5 singles by Valancius, Sanchez, Fick, Gagnon, and Van Scoyoc.
Hart has evened its Quarter Final Playoff record to 3-3 since 1987.
Hart had been in 2 Semi Final games and won them both.

## PAGE 4: 05/25/2004 @ Hart

In 1989 in the Semi Finals, Hart played South Hills. In those days the Quarter Finals were always held at a "neutral" home field, usually at a College/University or Jr. College. South Hills was the home team and chose nearby Gladstone High. Hart "Demolished" South Hills which featured 4 future Major Leaguers (Jason Giambi, Cory Lidle, Aaron Small and Shawn Wooten), but Hart had a future MLB player of their own in starting pitcher Andrew Lorraine, and beat South Hills 14-0

Hart lost the Final at Dodger Stadium in 1989: 4-1
In 1999 in the Semi Finals, Hart played Don Lugo at Hart, and led 16-0 after only 3 innings with Jamie Shields on the mound. Hart hit 5 homers in that game. 2 by Matt Friedrichsen his 10th and 11th, Jamie Shields, his 11th. Ryan Haag his 5th, and Justin Wiley his 3rd. Final score $16-0$ in 5 inning Mercy rule game as Hart only batted in 4 innings. Hart went on to win the CIF-DIV 2 Championship game at Anaheim Edison Field 10-9 against Righetti.

Note the following Div 2 Scores: El Dorado beat Norco in 8 innings 2-1.
Top Seed Villa Park was "drubbed" by Corona Santiago 11-4
Simi Valley 5 West Torrance 4 in 14 innings.
Century Wildcard El Dorado beat Norco 2-1 in 8 innings.
Hart plays El Dorado in the Semi Final game on Tuesday June 1. The home team will be determined by a coin flip tomorrow (Sat. May 29) at the CIF-SS office. As soon as I know where the game will be, I will e-mail everyone, and include the latest updated Div. 2 Brackets.

The 2004 Hart Baseball team is like the "Little Team that Could". They just don't give up, and now they are 1 game from playing in the CIF-SS Division II Championship game at Dodger Stadium on Saturday June 5.

First Hart must win the Semi Final game against El Dorado.
This will be a game between TWO WILD CARD TEAMS. So for sure, the Div. 2 Championship playoff game at Dodger Stadium will have a Wild Card team in the Game. * NOTE * Last year, Crespi, made the Div. 3 Championship game as a Wild Card, and won it. This year they may make it again as the $\# 1$ Seed in Div 3.

DIVISION II El Dorado 2, Norco 1 (8 innings):
The aggressive base running style preferred by the Placentia El Dorado baseball team was taking its toll Friday afternoon.

By the time the Golden Hawks reached extra innings against visiting Norco in a Southern Section Division II quarterfinal game, they'd already had a runner thrown out at every base.

But that didn't stop Brandon Schnebly from rolling the dice one more time in the bottom of the eighth. After his oneout high fly bounced off the glove of Norco right-fielder Toby Gerhart as he crashed into the fence, Schnebly slid safely into third base when Bryce Holland's feet tangled on his relay thrown. With the outfield drawn in, thirdbaseman Shaun Lane, whose error led to Norco's first-inning run, then fouled off consecutive two-strike pitches before lining the ball about five feet over the head of Gerhart for a 2-1 victory.
`'We've always been aggressive,'' El Dorado Coach Steve Gullotti said. '`We're not going to stop being aggressive just because we're in the playoffs. They had to make perfect throws, it was the one time they didn't.''
Mike Sandoval had a one-out triple for El Dorado in the fourth, tried to score when the next pitch went to the backstop but was tagged out by Norco pitcher James Simmons.

The Golden Hawks (21-9) had runners on second and third with no out in the fifth, but could only manage one run when pinch-runner Marcus Piazzisi was thrown out at third on a sacrifice fly that tied the score, 1-1. El Dorado also had a runner picked off first and another thrown out trying to steal second.

El Dorado left-hander Zach Pettikas (9-4) had his second consecutive strong outing of the postseason. After throwing a one-hit shutout last week against Whittier, he gave up three hits, all to Gerhart, and no earned runs to Norco (22-7).

El Dorado, which won section titles in 1999 and 2001, advanced to play Newhall Hart in Tuesday's semifinals.
Hart 5, Righetti 0
Tyler Fick (9-2) threw a two-hitter with nine strikeouts and three walks and Hart used a defensive gem in the sixth inning to preserve a $1-0$ lead before adding four unearned runs in the bottom of the inning to seal the victory. Ryan Gagnon drove in the first run with an infield hit in the fourth inning. In sixth inning, Steve Sanchez brought back a potential tying home run by Jimmy Dodos of Righetti (18-13). Nate Maddox delivered a double with two outs to score a runner that had reached on an error to make it 2-1. An error and walk brought in another run, a single by Sanchez made it 4-1, and another bases-loaded walk finished the rally. Hart (18-11-1), the third-place team from the Foothill League, will play El Dorado, the Century League's third-place finisher, on Tuesday at a site to be determined. Both teams are wild-card entrants, ensuring one will play in the Division II final at Dodger Stadium.

## Corona Santiago 11, Villa Park 4

Eight consecutive Santiago batters reached base with two out in the top of the seventh, turning a one-run lead into an eight-run cushion against the top-seeded Spartans. The Sharks (23-5) trailed, 3-0, heading into the fifth inning when Villa Park ace Mark Trumbo began to unravel. Trumbo, who has signed with USC, walked three batters and threw two wild pitches, which led to four runs. After Trumbo (10-2) retired the first two batters in the seventh, he and Dane Ferguson were chased by the seven-hit barrage. Bobby Kelly had three hits, including a two-run double in the seventh, for Santiago. Villa Park, the last remaining seeded team in Division II, finished 26-3.
