HIGHLIGHTS of Game# 11-06: Hart 4, West Torrance 3 (1st. Double Header Game# 1)

Hart wins the opening game against West Torrance 4-3 on passed ball with bases loaded in the bottom of the 7th.

The winning run scored in the bottom of the 7th on a passed ball with the bases loaded, no outs.

In that 7th inning, with a 3-3 tie, Daniel Timmerman, the West starting pitcher was still on the mound.

Connor O'Brien hit for Kevin Bailey and lined a double down the right field line.

Josh Brown ran for O'Brien.

Steve Rosso pinch hit for Cole Gasper and laid down a perfect bunt that the 3rd baseman wasn't expecting and had to eat the ball, as Brown cruised into 3rd.

Daniel Dietz was walked intentionally.

Tyler Glasnow pinch hit for Tommy Bilbo. On a 1-2 count the pitch was low and suddenly scooted right between the catchers legs slowly bounding to the back stop, Brown scored without a play and Hart had a hard won 4-3 win.

Things didn't have to be this close. Hart missed a big opportunity in the first.

Daniel Dietz opened with a line single to center, took 2nd on a bunt single to the pitcher by Tommy Bilbo. Luke Persico tried to sacrifice but it was right back to the pitcher who thought he had an easy out at 3rd, but he didn't realize the speed of Daniel Dietz who easily beat the throw to 3rd.

So Hart had the bases loaded and NO OUTS.

Then a bit of a disaster: Dallas Bacon hit a hard shot that the 3rd baseman looked like he caught an inch off the ground and Dietz started to scamper back to 3rd, but the 3rd baseman actually dropped the ball so Dietz had to run to the plate, where he was an easy out. Tommy Bilbo also thought the 3rd baseman had caught the ball and was an easy out when the catcher threw back to 3rd for another force out for a double play. Just a normal "routine every day" 5-2-5 double play.

In retrospect it was fortunate that the 3rd baseman didn't catch the ball because it would have been an easy triple play, possibly even and unassisted TP by the 3rd baseman.

So Hart had runners on 1st and 2nd but it was 2 out. Alex Tenorio then grounded a single through the 5-6 hole scoring Persico and Hart at least got 1 run out of a bases loaded no out situation.

Erik Vogel started for Hart and Baggio Saldivar was behind the plate for the first time this season.

On the 2nd batter Baggio tipped the bat of Daniel Timmerman and Timmerman was awarded first base.

That's the 2nd tipped bat of the season against Hart. We have gone most seasons with NO tipped bats but 6 games into the season we already have 2.

Austin Watters followed with a sharp single to right center sending Timmerman to 3rd.

Vogel then got a pop up to 3rd and a 3-1 fielder's choice to get out of the inning.

In the 3rd, West Torrance or West as they are known around the Bay League had Timmerman get a 1 out single, but he was immediately caught stealing. Watters hit a hard single up the middle and Johnny Palmer then hit a high fly down the right field line that stayed fair and over the 300 foot sign for a 2 run homer and West now led 2-1.

Hart came right back in their half of the 3rd. Dietz led off with a hard grounder into right field. He was balked to 2nd. With 1 out Luke Persico hit a hot shot past 3rd easily scoring Dietz from 2nd.

Dallas Bacon then slammed a shot to the right center field gap for a double as Persico scored all the way from first. Hart had the lead back 3-2.

For the next 2 innings it settled down to a pitchers duel between Vogel & Timmerman.

Vogel was removed in the top of the 6th and Josh Bendig made his Varsity debut on the mound for Hart.

Bendig got his first batter, but a bloop single to left center by Joey Notch followed by a single to deep short by Thomas Bray had him in trouble.

He got a very deep fly out to right and appeared he could get out of trouble. They put in a pinch runner Barry Thomas to run at 2nd. Bendig tried a few throws to pick him off. Then Collin Nelson singled through the hole left at short and West had tied the game up at 3-3.

Timmerman put Hart down in the bottom of the 6th and Ricky Torres came in to pitch the top of the 7th for Hart.

Ricky gave up a leadoff single to Timmerman and a pinch runner Christian D'Emilia ran for him.

D'Emilia was sacrificed to 2nd, but Torres was able to get nice easy fly ball outs to center and right to get out of the inning thus setting up the game winning heroics in the bottom of the 7th and Torres got his first Varsity win.

The game took just under 2 hours and everyone motored down the 405 freeway to Birmingham High.

It can be noted regarding Triple Plays. Hart pulled off its only Triple Play I know of in this series against West Torrance in 2009 in the 2nd game at Birmingham. Any of them could be credited with making big plays after entering in the seventh inning for the Hart baseball team.

Any way you slice it, they helped Hart earn a victory.

Brown scampered home on a passed ball in the bottom of the seventh inning, leading the Indians past West High of Torrance 4-3 in the first game of a doubleheader on Tuesday at Hart High School.

Hart also won the second game 2-0 at West High behind a three-hit shutout from Glasnow and two hits from Dallas Bacon.

In the first game, the passed ball came about because Glasnow put together a patient at-bat with the bases loaded and waited for West reliever Collin Nelson to make his mistake.

When he did, Brown pounced.

"It was kind of like slow motion," Brown said. "I read it well. My eyes got huge. I knew my team was going to be waiting at home if I could make it."

With the score tied 3-3 entering the bottom of the seventh, Hart pinch hitter Connor O'Brien led off by roping a double to right field that dropped just inside the foul line.

Another pinch hitter, Steve Rosso, followed with a perfect bunt single down the third-base line to put runners at first and second. After an intentional walk to leadoff hitter Daniel Dietz, Glasnow stepped up to the plate and the winning run followed.

But it all started with O'Brien, who stepped to the plate ready to make the most of the opportunity.

"I went up there thinking I was going to take three good hacks," he said. "They're the only three you get."

And he made one of them count.

The Indians (6-1) stayed patient at the plate for most of the afternoon, which was important because they belted several offerings from West starter Daniel Timmerman right at the defense behind him.

Nelson, who started at third base for West (4-3), made a couple of great plays in the field. The biggest came with the bases loaded in the bottom of the first, when he scooped a low liner, fired to home to get the first out and then tagged out the runner at third.

"That was just him being on his toes and giving us momentum," said West head coach Juan Cueva.

Still, Hart took the lead in the bottom of the first after center fielder Luke Persico singled and scored on a single by first baseman Alex Tenorio.

West responded with a two-run home run to right field by cleanup hitter John Palmer in the third. That was the only big mistake made by Hart starter Erik Vogel, who went five innings and allowed two runs on four hits.

"Vogel pitched well today," said Hart head coach Jim Ozella. "He threw five good innings. Our defense was good. Hopefully we can keep building on that."

Hart took back the lead in the third. Dietz singled, advanced to second on a balk and scored on an RBI single by Persico. Dallas Bacon then stepped up and doubled home Persico to put the Indians ahead 3-2.

West tied the game with an RBI single by Nelson in the top of the sixth, setting the stage for the late drama.

Hart reliever Ricky Torres earned the win, pitching a scoreless seventh and giving up one hit.
