I'm not yet sure how we ever got this game in.

Canyon and West Ranch decided to play today's game yesterday since Canyon's field had dried and today's game was due for rain.

West Ranch won 12-2

Valencia and Golden Valley decided to start their game at 1PM with the impending rain due by 3PM

Valencia won 10-0 I believe.

Hart and Saugus could only move their start time up from 3:15pm to 3:00PM.

There was a drizzle about 15 minutes before game time but it was very light and intermittent.

By 3PM it was drizzling steady and remained steady almost the entire game.

As the game wore on the pitchers mound and batters box area continued to be very slippery and wet.

The umpires interrupted the game at least 6 times, maybe more to put Diamond Dust on the dirt sections.

These delays were 10 minutes or more and the rain continued throughout.

Erik Vogel started for Hart and gave up 2 out single on a high pop up into the rain that looked foul, but the time it came down it landed just foul half way to the first base bag and rolled fair. He got by the first inning on a hard liner to left.

Justin Donatella started for Saugus and Hart went down easily on 2 strikeouts in the 1st.

In the 2nd for Saugus, Vogel got a pop up but then gave up a long homer to right center by Evan Steen.

Hart answered back in their half of the 2nd. With 1 out Alex Tenorio lined a hard single to left and was wild pitched to 2nd. Connor O'Brien grounded a single up the middle scoring Tenorio to tie it for Hart 1-1.

The umpires called for the field to be dried with the Diamond Dust dirt and it became a regular job for the Hart subs and assistant coach Kyle Boggio every inning from then on.

In the 3rd for Saugus, Vogel got in trouble by hitting the # 9 hitter & first batter Donatella. Then with 1 out the # 2 batter for Saugus Connor Wilson slammed a gap double to left center, scoring Donatella all the way from first. Saugus led 2-1.

In the Hart 3rd, Steve Rosso opened with a double down the left field line. After a pop out, Daniel Dietz singled hard to left, but too hard and Rosso had to stop at 3rd. Dietz then stole 2nd and Hart had runners at 2nd & 3rd, only 1 out but a strikeout and a come backer to the mound spoiled a promising inning.

Hart pitcher Erik Vogel seemed to settle in pretty good considering the conditions.

In the next 3 innings he spaced out 2 hits and 2 walks, leaving all 4 runners stranded.

As the rain continued into the 4th, I was wondering if the umpire would call the game after 5 innings when it would be a complete game. (Not sure on that for High School rules and no one else I talked to was sure on that either.

So it was important that Hart get something going.

Hart tied the game in the 4th as the rain continued. With 1 out Alex Tenorio hit a fly ball to left that fell in for a single. Connor O'Brien grounded a single up the middle, Tenorio took 2nd. Baggio Saldivar was hit by a pitch to load the bases with only 1 out.

Steve Rosso then hit a Sacrifice Fly to right scoring Tenorio with the Tying run and it was deep enough to move O'Brien to 3rd.

Cole Gasper pinch hit for Josh Brown and hit a very hard shot to left, but the rain coming down enabled the left fielder to haul it in.

Hart started out the 5th with Daniel Dietz leading off. The rain seemed to dissipate at that point, and it looked like they were going to get the game to conclusion.

Dietz slammed a hard liner to right, the right fielder tried to make a head first dive to catch it but it hit the ground first, the right fielder was able to keep the ball in front of him and Hart had their speedster on base, but the running conditions were poor.

Kevin Bailey laid down a great sacrifice bunt moving Dietz to 2nd.

Luke Persico then hit a hard shot past 3rd, easily scoring Dietz as Hart led 3-2.

Persico stole 2nd. Bacon walked.

Tenorio then got his 3rd straight hit a line single to left scoring Persico, sending Bacon to 3rd, Tenorio took 2nd on the throw to the plate. Hart Led 4-2.

O'Brien then also got his 3rd straight hit a single up the middle scoring Bacon, Tenorio stopped at 3rd. Hart led 5-2 That was it for Donatella as Saugus relieved him with Dylan Freyre.

On the first pitch to Saldivar Freyre uncorked a wild pitch scoring Tenorio Hart led 6-2.

Then in the top of the 6th the rain started again. More Diamond dirt delay.

Daniel Dietz led off with his 3rd single of the day. Tommt Bilbo hit for Kevin Bailey and was immediately hit by pitch. The Saugus coach complained that he had bunted the ball and the umpires conversed with each other for so long, I thought they were discussing whether the call the game. Meanwhile the rain was getting real heavy.

The inning came to a sudden end as Dietz was picked off on a play that looked like the umps wanted to get this one over, but that was fine since Hart had a nice 6-2 lead. With the conditions deteriorating, Bilbo tried to steal 2nd and the pitch was a wild pitch and Bilbo made it all the way to 3rd. After a strikeout Hart got a gift run when with

Bacon at bat, another wild pitch scored Bilbo and Hart led 7-2.

Erik Vogel took the mound in the top of the 6th after a long delay to spread Diamond dirt. He struck out the pinch hitter but gave up a hard single to the leadoff batter Nick Lombardi his 2nd hit of the game. When he walked the # 2 batter Connor Wilson, Hart coach Jim Ozella went to the mound and relieved Vogel with Bobby Stafford got the very good Saugus hitter Justin Sheehan to hit a nubber just to the right of the mound. As Daniel Dietz charged to pick up the ball Lombardi bumped into Dietz and every one was safe and the bases were loaded. Hart coach Ozella then talked with the umpires and tried to get the interference called. He didn't get the call and the rain was turning into a down pore.

The umps called for more Diamond dirt and were not satisfied with the spread and called for more. It looked like Hart had run out of the stuff. The ump was not happy and the plate was so thick with mud he called for a towel to clean it off. It was getting dark, cold and the rain was pounding down. The Tying run was standing in the on deck circle. Saugus then sent up a pinch hitter Tyler Klipfel for their cleanup hitter Brad Buchignani. Buchignani was hitting .111 going into the game and was 1 for 3 at that point. Klipfel was hitting .429 (3 for 7). Stafford battled, Klipfel kept fouling pitches off in the rain and Stafford wasn't getting the calls on 3 of his pitches and the count went to 3-2 after another foul Klipfel struck out swinging. Up came Dylan Freyre. Evan Steen who hit the homer was on deck. The bases were still loaded but Hart did have the 5 run Freyre hit the first pitch and hit a lazy fly into the rain in right field. Tommy Bilbo who had pinch hit for Bailey in the 6th, gathered it in and Hart is now 8-1.

Hart pitcher Erik Vogel wasn't fazed.
Not when his team fell behind early in the game.
Not when he gave up a home run.

He certainly wasn't bothered by the rain, which pelted down throughout Hart's 7-2 win over Saugus on Wednesday at Hart High School.
The Indians (8-1, 2-0) trailed 2-1 heading into the fourth inning with the strong possibility of the game being called early because of the weather.

"When things kind of went bad for a couple innings, Erik stuck with his plan and really kept after it," said Hart head coach Jim Ozella.

Though the game had to be stopped several times to apply moisture-absorbing dirt on the pitcher's mound and the area around home plate, all seven innings were played.

"That thing was just terrible," Vogel said of the condition of the mound. "It was muddy. It was just terrible."

Vogel allowed the two runs and six hits in 6 1/3 innings to improve to 2-0 this season.
As the game went on, pitchers on both sides struggled to get their footing and hitters had trouble accelerating out of the box toward first base.

"It's not easy to pitch, it's not easy to hit, it's not easy to do anything," Ozella said.

Vogel's win was made possible by Hart's four runs in the fifth inning, after which it led 6-2.
Saugus starter Justin Donatella limited the Indians' bats until the fifth, but Saugus (3-5, 1-1) fell victim to a rally that included RBI hits by Luke Persico, Alex Tenorio and Connor O'Brien.

"We definitely wanted to pull ahead early because we knew our pitching would lock it down," Persico said.

For the most part, the Centurions' bats were kept quiet - or at least kept in the park.
Other than Evan Steen's solo home run in the second inning, Saugus hit several balls deep into the outfield, but most ended up in the glove of a Hart outfielder.

"When we were hitting, we had too many fly-ball outs," said Saugus catcher Nick Warren. "We didn't really make their defense work."

In the seventh inning, the Centurions gave a last gasp, loading the bases with one out.
But Hart reliever Bobby Stafford earned a strikeout and one final flyout to end the threat.
Saugus scored its other run off Connor Wilson's RBI double in the third, which gave it a 2-1 lead.
Hart got its first two runs on an RBI single by O'Brien in the second and a Steve Rosso sacrifice fly in the fourth.
Tommy Bilbo came across the plate on a wild pitch in the sixth to score the Indians' final run of the game.

"I just told the guys I was quite impressed with their maturity and persistence," Ozella said.
