## HIGHLIGHTS of Game\# 11-19: Hart 2, Saugus 1 (Foothill League Game \# 8)

Hart down 1-0 all game gets 2 in 7 th to pull out dramatic 2-1 win.

When I left home for the game from Van Nuys, it was dark, dreary and cold.
When I arrived at Saugus around 2 pm , the clouds were gone, the sun was out and looked forward to a great game.
Yesterday (Tuesday), Valencia lost West Ranch 2-0 in a rainout makeup game, thus Hart was tied with Valencia for 1 st place at 5-2.
So Hart needed a victory to keep pace.
In the 1st inning the Gloom seemed to still be with the Hart 9.
Justin Donatella their Ace, started for last place Saugus sporting a 3-2 record with a 3.37ERA
Daniel Dietz led off by getting hit by pitch.
Kevin Bailey pushed a bunt toward 1st which was so good, he beat it out.
Great!!... Runners on 1 st and 2nd NO out.
But then disaster.
With the runners going Luke Persico missed the bunt and Daniel Dietz was hung out to dry sliding into 3rd.
Worse, they then threw to 2nd and caught Kevin Bailey sliding into 2nd.
So 2 caught stealing on a double steal attempt.
Tyler Glasnow started for Hart with a $4-1$ record and a glittering 0.39 ERA
With at least 15 scouts or more all pointing their Radar guns on his offerings, Glasnow struck out the 1st batter, but then gave up 2 hits.
A nifty 6-4-3 double play got him out of the inning.
In the bottom of the 2 nd Glasnow was his own worst enemy.
He opened up the inning by hitting Austin Rodriguez.
Evan Steen struck out.
Dylan Freyre hit a shot up the middle that Glasnow got his glove on but Freyre easily beat it out for an infield single.
Tylor Klipfel was hit by pitch to load the bases.
Nick Warren coaxed a walk to drive in Rodriguez.
Glasnow then got an infield pop up to 2 nd and a strikeout but Saugus led after 2 innings 1-0.
Thereafter Glassnow was lights out for the next 4 innings.
He struck out the side in the 3 rd and 5 th, and from the 2 nd into the 7 th retired 15 straight batters.
Meantime Hart batters were having trouble getting any runs against Donatella.
He had the Hart batters basically playing pepper with the 3rd baseman Nick Lombardi who wasn't letting anything get by him
Except for a 3 up 3 down inning in the 4 th, Hart was getting a hit in every inning. Bailey's single in the 1st, Connor O'Brien singled in the 2nd. Dallas Bacon singled in the 5th, Steve Rosso doubled in the 5th, Daniel Dietz singled in the 6th.
Except for Bailey and Dietz all the hits were with 2 out and Donatella was then up to the task.
Down 1-0 into the top of the 7 th, it was do or die for Hart.
Alex Tenorio singled sharply to left.
Garrett Gooding pinch hit for Connor 0 'Brien and slammed a double of the right field wall scoring Tenorio all the way from first and Hart had tied the game 1-1. Renton Pexa ran for Gooding.
Baggio Saldivar hit a grounder to short, with Pexa running the short stop felt better getting Saldivar at first so the
lead run was at 3 with only 1 out.
With Steve Rosso up, the Saugus infield was playing in for a play at the plate. The Hart faithful groaned when Rosso hit a high pop up around 2nd base, but wait!!!
With the infield in at least 4 players, center, right, short and second baseman all had a chance at the ball and then suddenly the ball fell to the ground with no one touching it. Pexa scored the lead run Hart led 2-1.
Rosso who was pinch run for after his double in the 5 th and then re-entered, had to run for himself.
Donatella immediately balked him to 2nd. Cole gasper hit a screaming shot in the 5-6 hole but the very capable 3rd baseman Nick Lombardi snagged it just before it hit the ground and Rosso had to hold at second.
A wild pitch put Rosso on 3rd but Daniel Dietz flied to center.
In the bottom of the 7th, Luke Persico moved from center field to shortstop replacing Cole Gasper and Trevor Brown went to center.
Hart pitcher Tyler Glasnow took the mound now with a chance for the win and struck out the first batter Evan Steen, but it wasn't easy as the ball was in the dirt and Hart catcher Rosso had to throw him out at first, and the throw almost hit the runner.
My comment at the time was that this felt like that 9-8 loss to Valencia.
The 2nd batter Dylan Freyre hit a high pop up just in front of home plate but the ball plopped to the turf and instead of rolling foul, it was almost plugged about 3 feet in front of home plate, Freyre was safe at first with a Single. Glasnow then struck out Tylor Klipfel for the 2 nd out.

With Nick Warren up Freyre stole 2nd base to get into scoring position as the potential tying run.
Warren then hit a hard line drive over 2nd base toward center. Luke Persico might have been closer to 2 nd to keep Freyre closer to the bag and did a full out extension of his body and snagged that liner which would have surely scored the tying run.
Instead it was the 3rd out, a fielding GEM if $I$ ever saw one and Hart had the victory.
Hart will play Saugus at Hart on Friday: First pitch at $3: 15 \mathrm{pm}$. As a guess I believe Garrett Gooding will start for Hart.

Sometimes the best way to judge a pitcher is to based on his response when under duress.
Enter Hart's Tyler Glasnow, who struggled a bit with control early on Wednesday and had to pitch with his team behind nearly the entire game.

Glasnow's refusal to give in paid off in the seventh inning, when the Hart bats came up with two big runs that resulted in a 2-1 Foothill League victory over Saugus on Wednesday at Saugus High.

The senior right-hander tossed a complete game, allowing an earned run off three hits and striking out 11.
It spoiled another stellar outing by Saugus starter Justin Donatella, who also went the distance.
"(Glasnow) allowed us to hang around a little bit," said Hart head coach Jim Ozella. "It wasn't our best performance today, but he kept us within striking distance."

Pinch-hitter Garrett Gooding struck first for Hart (15-4, 6-2) in the seventh inning with the game on the line.
With Alex Tenorio on first base via a leadoff single, Gooding sent the ball into right field for an RBI double in his only at-bat of the game to knot things up at 1-1.

Two batters later, catcher Steve Rosso hit a lazy fly ball into shallow right field, but Saugus second baseman Dylan Freyre lost track of it and let it fall, scoring pinch-runner Renton Pexa from third.

The run was unearned, but it proved to be the eventual game-winner.
Donatella surrendered seven hits, struck out two and didn't walk a batter in a mostly formidable performance.
"Our guy deserved to win," said Saugus head coach John Maggiora. "As good as (Glasnow) was, our guy pitched as good or even better in some situations."

The Centurions ( $7-12,2-6$ ) took the $1-0$ lead in the second inning when Glasnow hit two batters and gave up a single to load the bases. He then issued the game's only walk to Nick Warren to allow the first run to come across.
"I was trying to throw too hard and was pulling out and lost a lot of velocity," Glasnow said. "But I took a little bit of velocity off later on and I started locating a lot better."

It turned out less was more. He got out of the jam with an infield pop-out and a strikeout. After giving up the run, Glasnow retired 17 of the remaining 18 Saugus batters in the game.
"There's times when you don't have your great stuff, but you've got to maintain, and I thought he did a great job of doing that," Ozella said.

The Indians remain tied for first place in the league with Valencia while Saugus has now lost six of its last seven Foothill games.
