HIGHLIGHTS of Game# 11-24: Hart 12, West Ranch 0 (Foothill League Game # 13)

Hart gets 19 hits, beats West Ranch 12-0: Rosso 4-4, Tenorio 3 doubles (again).

Hart had a "feel good" day today as they avenged the 4-3 loss at home Wednesday with a 12-0 shellacking of West Ranch on the Wildcats diamond.

After the 1st inning Hart scored in every inning. When they reached a 9-0 lead after 5 innings I remembered 2009 when Hart had the same 9-0 lead at the Cats den. At that time it was the final game of the season. Spenser Souza had just hit for the Cycle in reverse order (Homer, triple, double, single), and the Hart fans were jumping for joy.

But what happened in the next 2 innings was too gruesome for words but to make it short, they brought in J.C. Cloney and Cody Howard and both pitchers stopped Hart cold offensively.

West Ranch scored 6 runs in the 5th and 5 runs in the 6th to beat Hart 11-9. The biggest problem: it knocked Hart to 4th place.

But Hart was lucky, since it was the first year the CIF-ss put in the rule that 1 team from each 6 team league could make the playoff from 4th or 5th place if they had a .500 record or better and on that basis Hart qualified for the playoffs but fell in the Wild Card round to Camarillo.

But today things went better for Hart than in 2009. Garrett Gooding started and put the Cats down in the 1st with only a single.

Hart picked up 2 runs of J.C. Cloney in the 2nd when Luke Persico reached first on a shortstop error, took 3rd on a single by Connor O'Brien and scored on a fielders choice by Baggio Saldivar. Steve Rosso then hit a long single to right center easily scoring O'Brien but Rosso was out trying to stretch his hit into a double for the 1st out. Kevin Bailey and Daniel Dietz both followed with infield singles, but Garrett Gooding was out on an excuse me dribbler right back to the pitcher.

In the 2nd with 2 out Gooding gave up a walk and a single to Jake Miura and Justin Hovis but ended the inning with a strikeout.

Then Hart got things going in the 3rd against Cloney. After Dallas Bacon filed deep to center, Alex Tenorio doubled, Luke Persico doubled scoring Tenorio. After a strikeout, Baggio Saldivar singled in Persico. Saldivar stole 2nd and Steve Rosso singled in Saldivar but Rosso was again out when he tried to get to 2nd, but the 3rd run of the inning was in and Hart led 5-0.

Gooding put the Wildcats down in the 3rd, striking out the first 2 batters and Tommy Bilbo made a great catch of a line drive in center to end the inning. On the 2nd batter, a pitch in the dirt then hit Hart catcher Steve Rosso in or near the throat and it looked at first he would not be able to resume play but like all catchers everywhere he continued on and caught a foul tip 2nd strike and you knew all was going to be well with Steve Rosso.

In the 4th inning with Steven Farnsworth now in relief of J.C. Cloney, Hart went right to work on him also. After Bailey lined out to short, Daniel Dietz singled up the middle, after Gooding flied out, Dallas Bacon singled right, sending Dietz to 2nd. Alex Tenorio doubled to the right center field gap scoring both Dietz and Bacon. Luke Persico then singled in Tenorio. The inning ended with Persico was out stealing, the 3rd Hart player out on the base paths in 3 innings, but Hart was sailing along with a 7-0 lead.

Gooding gave up a walk in the bottom of the 4th but ended the inning on a strikeout.

In the top of the 5th. With 1 out Saldivar lined out hard to right. Steve Rosso singled to center and stayed at first and all the Hart players gave him a big cheer. Renton Pexa ran for Rosso. Pexa took 2nd on a wild pitch and scored on a single to right by Kevin Bailey. Hart led 9-0.

Gooding gave up a leadoff single to Justin Hovis but got a strike out, Pop up and then gave up his 2nd walk, but got a pop up to second to end the inning with Hart leading 9-0.

In the 6th, Hart went right at Farnsworth again. Gooding singled to center and Adam Parr ran for him. Dallas Bacon then hit a long double to left center sending Parr to 3rd. Problem was I saw Parr miss 2nd base and could only hope the umpires didn't see him miss the bag, but no such luck. In High school the umpire can call the play without any prodding from the opponent coach and they told Parr he was out although he didn't believe it to be the case. So Hart lost another base runner (the 4th of the game), but with a 9-0 lead hopefully it didn't matter. Alex Tenorio then slammed his 3rd double of the game tying a Hart record held by 7 others players, including Alex Tenorio himself who did it also against West Ranch on 4/1/2001: I will list them all tomorrow at the following Link: <http://www.hartbaseballstats.com/HARTBS06.pdf>

The double by Tenorio scored Bacon and Hart led 10-0. It also knocked Farnsworth out of the game and Aaron Watkins came in and got 2 strikeouts to end the threat further.

In the bottom of the 6th, Gooding got a strikeout and a ground out but gave up a single to Watkins and then a single to pinch hitter Aaron Smirnoff who was being DH'ed for. Gooding then got a fly to right to preserve the shutout at 10-0.

In the top of the 7th, with Watkins on the mound, Baggio Saldivar worked a walk. Steve Rosso then got his 4th hit of the game, this time a long double that he safely made it to 2nd on as his team mates were kidding him. Baggio Saldivar took 3rd.

Josh Brown then pinch hit and hit a slow roller towards second that he easily beat out scoring Saldivar.

It was Hart's 19th hit, easily topping the 15 that they had against Beekman in the 3rd place Spring tournament game at Woodbridge.

Cole Gasper then pinch hit for Dietz and hit a Sacrifice fly to right, deep enough to score Rosso from 3rd as he had a smile a mile wide as he crossed the plate with the 12th run for Hart.

Apparently the last 2 innings were tough enough on Garrett Gooding and so Hart brought in Ricky Torres to try and at least get a team shut out, as Gooding would not qualify for the shutout as he did not complete the game.

Torres walked the leadoff pinch hitter J.D. Krauskopf who was immediately singled to 2nd by Farnsworth, so the shutout was looking not too good.

However Torres as he has done all season then got the next 3 outs in quick order with an easy fly to left, pop up foul at the Hart dugout along first by Tenorio and closed it with a flourish with a strikeout.

Hart has the win 12-0.

Going into the game Hart was only 1 game up on West Ranch. A loss would have put Hart in a Tie with West Ranch and the Cats would have had the tie breaker.

Cary Osborne of The-Signal was at the game: Here is a Copy-Paste of his article:

It's uncharacteristic for West Ranch starting pitcher J.C. Cloney to have a day like he did on Friday in his team's 12-0 loss to Hart at West Ranch High.

There had to be some explanation.

The Indians provided it.

Lots of teams like to give the cliché answer of "we practiced well."

Hart (18-6, 9-4) practiced smart.

The Indians had pitching coach Kyle Boggio, a former Hart pitcher who pitched professionally in an independent league, conduct batting practice on Thursday. The left-hander gave the Indians a mix of offspeed and hard stuff - exactly what they would see from Cloney, who came into the game with a 2.23 ERA.

On Friday, Cloney was out of the game by the fourth inning.

"We had a good game plan coming in. We knew what we were going to see," said Hart catcher Steve Rosso. "(Because of that), everything looked like a beach ball."

Rosso was 4-for-4 in the game with two RBIs, earning him a steak dinner as another coach, Jerry Miller, said earlier in the season he would take any Hart player out who went 4-for-4.

The Indians had 19 hits in the game.

Alex Tenorio, who has been on a tear of late, went 3-for-4 with three doubles and three RBIs.

The first time Hart saw Cloney this season, a 2-0 Indians win on April 1, Tenorio was 3-for-3 with three doubles.

"We came with the mindset that we had to win today," Tenorio said. "We didn't want to have a tied record."

If West Ranch (13-10-1, 7-6) had won the game, it would have had the same Foothill League record as the Indians, but it would have owned the tiebreaker because of a season-series victory. The way things are shaping up, it appears that one of these teams will be the Foothill's second-place team. The win in this game likely meant the difference between a home game and a road game in the first round of the CIF-Southern Section Division I playoffs.

But a road game might not be so bad either.

A victory on the road in the first round would likely present an automatic home game in the second round.

A coin-flip victory could present another possible home game in the third round.

"If you're going to make a deep run in the playoffs, you can spin it that way," said West Ranch head coach Casey Burrill. "But we need to move on from this. This needs to be forgotten for the playoffs."

Burrill said this was the best offensive showing against his team all season long.

Hart scored in every inning but the first - that's two in the second, three in the third, three in the fourth, one in the fifth, one in the sixth and two more in the seventh.

Cloney went three innings, allowing eight hits and five runs, four earned. West Ranch's bullpen allowed another seven runs in four innings.

On the other side, Hart starting pitcher Garrett Gooding was stellar.

In six innings of work, he struck out seven batters, allowing five hits and three walks. West Ranch's Justin Hovis had two of those hits.

"I got ahead and was able to use my change-up. They were sitting on my fastball and curveball," Gooding said on why he had success. "I knew our team was going to hit. Fortunately we got 12 runs. That definitely helped."

Hart can now do no worse than second in the Foothill League and West Ranch can do no worse than third place. Yet the Indians are still in the hunt for the league title.
